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

Message from the president

Dear fellow members of the Academy

It is already 18 months since the last Ceremonial Meeting of the Academy in Paris, and we look forward to the next one, which will take place during the 42nd International Congress for the History of Pharmacy. This is being held from Tuesday 8 to Friday 11 September, 2015 at the Istanbul University Convention Centre in Istanbul, Turkey. Since the last Ceremonial Meeting of the Academy the Executive Committee has been considering the desirability and implications of setting up its own dedicated website. Such a website would act as an additional forum for Academy members between the biennial congress and the twice yearly Communications, and as a 'shop window' for prospective members and the public to find out more about the Academy.

We have now looked at the kind of information that might appear on a website, whether there would be a need for a members only facility, and how often it would need updating. Some of the information would rarely need changing, such as notes about the history of the Academy and the statutes regulating its activities. Some information would need updating periodically; this would include the list of members, with additions and deletions and perhaps obituaries for those who have recently died.

Information requiring more regular updating might include lists of history of pharmacy events in different countries. However this function is already fulfilled on the International Society for the History of Pharmacy website at <http://www.histpharm.org/igp.htm>. An Academy website could also provide a platform for the distribution of its Communications, and to act as the

depository of its archive. However, Communications is already well distributed to almost all members as an email attachment.

We have also looked at the costs of possibly employing a website designer to take on the initial task of designing a website for us. A relatively simple website would cost around 2,000 Euro, although this cost could probably be reduced considerably if we found a student able to take this on, or even if there is an Academy member willing to do so.

The initial costs themselves are not a particular problem for the Academy. In any case a variety of 'freemium' website building platforms are available. As the name suggests these are free, with users only paying for any extras required. However it is likely that the Academy would only need a very basic site, and such a site might be a good option for us.

Getting started would entail choosing and securing a domain name. But a website needs to be hosted on a web server in order to make it accessible to users via the internet. Hosting involves housing, serving and maintaining files so that users are able to view the site contents; it acts as the gateway between the website and the web itself.

Before taking this forward the committee are anxious to ensure that someone is available to take responsibility for acting as the webmaster, and updating the website on a regular basis. Without such a person there is a danger that information on an Academy website would become increasingly out of date. We are therefore interested in hearing from any member who might be willing to take on this role.

The Congress remains the major opportunity for Academy members to meet together and to discuss issues of common interest. I look forward to seeing many of you there and to hear about your recent activities in the history of pharmacy.

Informations diverses / Informations

Two new candidates have been identified to joint our International Academy, from Germany and from USA: The first is proposed by Wolf-Dietter Mueller-Janckhe and supported by Maria Carmen Francès Causapé: PROF. DR. RER. NAT. FRANK LEIMKUGEL. You will find his CV and Bibliography at the end of this issue of Communications. The second is professor Michael A. Flannery, proposed by John Parascandola and Gregory Higby. His CV is also at the end. If no opposition are expressed, these candidates will be wellcomed during our next meeting in Istanbul. These new members are supposed to replace the seat of W-D Mueller Janckle that has reach 70, and the one of John Parascandola. According to our statuts, they will become honorary members.

Austria

The Austrian Society for the History of Pharmacy mourns the death of Prof. Mag.pharm. Dr.phil. **Otto Nowotny** who passed away on January 14, 2015 at the age of 99. He was an internationally recognised historian of pharmacy and a very active member of our society. He published about 200 articles on different topics of history of pharmacy and contributed greatly to the knowledge of the Austrian history of pharmacy. All colleagues will always keep him in honorable memory.

France

En plus de ce que nous avons rapporté dans le dernier numéro de Communications en octobre dernier, l'année 2015 sera une année très riche pour la SHP :

En mars dernier, nous avons eu une session spéciale sur les Pharmacopées, en lien avec Lemery qui est mort il y a 300 ans (1645-1715). Cette réunion était commune avec la Société Française d'Histoire de la Médecine. Une autre réunion aura lieu en septembre sur Lémery et Charas, organisée avec le Club d'Histoire de la chimie. Enfin, une exposition sur

Lémery sera organisée avec la bibliothèque de la Faculté de Pharmacie de Paris. Nous aurons par ailleurs deux autres séances, en juin et décembre, et plusieurs membres participeront au congrès international à Istanbul.

In addition to our previous report in Communications, last October, the French Society of History of Pharmacy will be very active in 2015:

In March 2015, we have had a special meeting about pharmacopeias, in conjunction with Lemery, who died three hundred years ago (1645-1715). This was organized jointly with the French Society of History of Medicine. In September, we will have a special meeting on Lemery himself and Charas, organized jointly with the French Historical Society of Chemistry (Club d'histoire de la chimie). Also a specific Exhibit on Lemery will be done with the Library of the Faculté de Pharmacie of Paris. We will also have two other meetings in June and December, and many members will participate in the Istanbul meeting.

Italie

Our Colleague Giovanni Cipriani informed us that the next national congress of Italian Academy of History of Pharmacy will be held in Milan, May 30-31, in Palazzo Grassi.

Robert Buerki received a University of Wisconsin Honorary Citation October 24 for "significant contributions to pharmacy education and professional development activities . . . and support of the School of Pharmacy," including a generous donation from him and his wife Leslie which provided three-quarters of the funds needed for the new George Urdang Chair in the History of Pharmacy at the School of Pharmacy.

UK

In October 2014 **Stuart Anderson** (Great Britain) gave the biennial Poynter Lecture to the British Society for the History of Medicine. His lecture, entitled **Preaching, Politics and Philanthropy: The Quakers in Pharmacy 1650 to 1900**, was presented to a large and knowledgeable audience at the Wellcome Institute, London.

In February 2014 he presented a talk on **Disease, Dirt and Disaster: The Real World of the Victorian Pharmacy** to the Northern Area Conference of the British Pharmaceutical Students Association entitled ***Pharmacy Past, Present and Future*** held at the University of Strathclyde in Glasgow.

Turquie

The 11th national conference on the history of pharmacy in Turkey was held May 25-28, 2014 at Erciyes University in Kayseri with an attendance of 127 participants, including pharmacy historians from abroad: three members from the SHP (France) and one member from DGGP (Germany). The main theme of this conference was the history of complementary therapies in Turkish pharmacy. A total of 58 communications were presented during this conference, where Prof. Afife Mat was also awarded with the Pharmacist Hamdi Bey Award, which has been given since 2002 and is named after the first Turkish community pharmacist of the Ottoman Empire.

In June 2014, Turkey's first association for the history of pharmacy was officially founded, and Prof. Mat was elected as the president of the association. In September, Prof. Mat also attended the annual conference of the Italian Academy for the History of Pharmacy, held in Ferrara, where she delivered a talk on the first museum of the history of pharmacy in Turkey.

TETAG is going to organize the 42nd ICHP to be held September 8-11, 2015 in Istanbul. The main theme of the congress is: "The Exchange of Pharmaceutical Knowledge between east and West". Further information can be found online at www.42ichp.org.

La 11ème conference nationale d'histoire de la pharmacie en Turquie a eu lieu du 25 au 28 mai 2014 à l'Université Erciyes de Kayseri avec 127 participants, y compris des historiens de la pharmacie étrangers : 3 membres de la SHP (France) et un membre de la DGGP (Allemagne). Le thème principal de cette conférence fut l'histoire des thérapies complémentaires de la pharmacie turque. 58 communications ont été présentées et le professeur A. Mat a reçu le prix du Pharmacien Hamdi Bey, décerné depuis 2002 en l'honneur du premier pharmacien d'officine turc de l'Empire Ottoman.

En juin 2014, la première association turque d'histoire de la pharmacie a été créée, et le professeur A. Mat a été élue présidente de l'association. En septembre, le professeur A. Mat a participé au congrès de l'Académie italienne d'histoire de la pharmacie de Ferrara, où elle a présenté une communication sur le premier musée d'histoire de la pharmacie en Turquie.

TETAG va organiser le 42^{ème} CIHP du 8 au 11 septembre 2015 à Istanbul. Le thème principal du Congrès est l'échange des connaissances pharmaceutiques entre l'Orient et l'Occident. Les détails de ce congrès se trouvent sur le site www.42ichp.org.
