Message du président

Chers collègues membres de l'Académie internationale d'histoire de la pharmacie

Tout d'abord, j'espère que tous nos membres et leurs familles supportent les bouleversements actuels associés à la crise sanitaire mondiale du COVID-19.

Lors de mon dernier éditorial, j'ai évoqué avec vous le sujet des statuts de notre Académie et la nécessité de les déposer dans un pays pour permettre l'ouverture d'un compte bancaire au nom de l'Académie, ce qui n'était pas possible à l'époque. Comme convenu, j'ai poursuivi la démarche entreprise et déposé nos statuts en France qui ont été acceptés sans difficulté, ce qui nous a permis d'ouvrir un compte bancaire et y mettre les (faibles) économies de notre association. Pour permettre un suivi des comptes en français, c'est désormais Joelle Ricordel qui a pris en charge des finances de notre Académie et je tiens à la remercier pour avoir accepté. Je remercie également Axel Helmstädt pour avoir assuré le rôle de trésorier toutes ces dernières années. Comme vous le savez peut-être, le prochain Congrès international d'histoire de la pharmacie de Milan a été reporté à 2022 compte tenu des événements actuels, et par conséquent aussi la séance officielle de notre Académie qui a en particulier pour objet d'accueillir les nouveaux membres. N'hésitez pas bien sûr à faire des propositions dans ce domaine, en particulier pour les

pays où nous avons un nombre réduit de membres ou pas de membre du tout !

En tant qu'historien de la pharmacie, cette crise du COVID-19 n'est pas sans rappeler d'autres épidémies dans l'histoire, en particulier la peste noire au XIV^e siècle où entre le tiers et plus de la moitié de la population européenne a péri. Si la peste et le Covid-19 ne se ressemblent guère, puisque leur nosologie, leur étiologie ou encore leur létalité divergent fortement, on ne peut s'empêcher de lire ici ou là des évocations de la pandémie médiévale, pour en faire aussi bien un miroir de nos peurs qu'un précurseur de certaines mesures de santé. Le confinement par exemple, expérimenté pour la première fois à Raguse (Dubrovnik) en 1377, puis à Venise, Vérone et à Milan au tournant du siècle, a été utilisé tout au long de l'époque moderne pour être abandonné peu après l'arrivée du choléra en 1831 : une mesure « de terreur », considérée au XIX^e siècle non seulement comme inopérante mais aussi « comme violente » et « digne des siècles de barbarie » pour reprendre les mots du médecin et homme politique socialiste français, Ange Guépin, en 1836. Les mêmes débats ressurgissent aujourd'hui et questionnent régulièrement les avis d'experts qui soutiennent les décisions des Etats. Quant aux traitements miracles, certains s'en sont fait les champions à toutes les époques. Comme le souligne l'historienne Marylin Nicoud, « le Moyen Âge est certes loin mais offre aussi un miroir troublant aux questionnements du présent ».

Message from the president

Dear colleagues, members of the International Academy of the History of Pharmacy

First of all, I hope that all our members and their families are coping with the current turmoil associated with the global health crisis of COVID-19. In my last editorial, I raised with you the subject of the byelaws of our Academy and the need to deposit them in a country to allow the opening of a bank account in the name of the Academy, which was not possible at the time. As agreed, I continued the process and deposited our byelaws in France, where they were accepted without difficulty, allowing us to open a bank account and to deposit the (small) savings of our association. In order to allow a follow-up of the accounts (in French), Joelle Ricordel has now taken charge of the finances of our Academy, and I would like to thank her for having accepted this role. I would also like to thank Axel Helmstädtter for having acted as our treasurer since 2013.

As you may already have heard, the next International Congress on the History of Pharmacy in Milan has been postponed until September 2022 in view of current events. Consequently, the official session of our Academy, which is particularly intended to welcome new members, has also been postponed. Of course, we continue to welcome proposals for new members of the Academy, especially from countries where we have a reduced number of members, or even no members at all!

As historians of pharmacy, this COVID-19 crisis reminds us of other epidemics in history, in particular the Black Death in the 14th century where between a third and more than half of the European population perished. Although the plague and Covid-19 are hardly similar, since their nosology, etiology and lethality differ greatly, we cannot help but read here and there references to the medieval pandemic, making it both a mirror of our fears and a precursor of certain health measures. Confinement, for example, first experimented with in Ragusa (Dubrovnik) in 1377, then in Venice, Verona and Milan at the turn of the century, was used throughout modern times, only to be abandoned shortly after the arrival of cholera in 1831. It was seen as a measure "of terror", and was considered in the 19th century not only unworkable but also "violent" and "worthy of centuries of barbarity", in the words of the French socialist physician and politician, Ange Guépin, in 1836.

The same debates resurface today, and regularly question the opinions of experts who support the decisions of States. As for miracle treatments, some have championed them throughout history. As the historian Marylin Nicoud points out, "the Middle Ages are certainly far away, but they also offer a troubling mirror to the questions of the present".

Doctor Pharmacist Graziella-Lygia-Narcisa Baicu (1922-2020)



Graziella Lygia-Narcisa Baicu (1922-2020) was a former member of the International Academy of History of Pharmacy. She was born in Sulina, in Tulcea county (a town where the European Comission of Danube was set) on 6th of June 1922. She stated that she was baptised in the village of Sacu, Caraş-Severin county.

She graduated the Faculty of Letters (1947) and the Faculty of Pharmacy (1948), both from Bucharest, doctor in Pharmaceutical Sciences (1975), member in the International Academy of History of Pharmacy (Sevilla 15 September 1974) and „academician emeritus” from 1992. She had a fruitful professional activity: scientific and editorial in the The State Institute of the Control of Drug and Pharmaceutical Research (ICSMCF) „Petre-Ionescu Stoian”, in the Society of Medical Sciences, Pharmaceutical section and at the Medical Publishing House, in Bucharest.

From 1st of March 1949 as editorial secretary she contributed to the scientific journal *Farmacia* (Pharmacy) publication of the General College of Pharmacists. She activated here only for two months, then the publication was abolished because the College, the head institution was abolished, with the nationalization that took place on 2nd of April 1949. She took the initiative of redacting an informative publication called *CENTROFARM – Informative journal*, ensuring the contents and all the typographic activity. The journal had ten numbers (August 1949-December 1950) and it had several subjects as form letters, provisions, instructions, legal texts etc., regarding legal, technical, organizational and methodological regulations, by which the new pharmaceutical activity was based on the criteria of socialist economy and central planification.

She also had other functions: general secretary at the editorial office of the journal *Farmacia* (01.03.1953-09.1958); she collaborated to publish 3 Medical Agendas 1955, 1956, 1957, publications coordinated by General Pharmaceutical Direction (DGF) from National Health Minister; between 1973-1988 she contributed to the publication of the journal *Farmacovigilență* (*Pharmacovigilence*), 64 quarterly numbers were published.

She published around 60 scientific works as:

18 monographs of pharmacists and physicians- 18 monografii de farmaciști și medici, published in the The Encyclopedia Of Personalities, vol. I-II-III, Ed. Geneze 1999-2001; vol. IV Contemporans A-I, Ed. Geneze 2003, p. 77-82.

On 11th November 2015, at the Faculty of Pharmacy from Bucharest she received the Medal „Prof. Dr. Farmacist Alexandru Ionescu-Matiu”, for the entire activity as scientific researcher in the History of Pharmacy.

As a conclusion. She was one of the most important personalities in the history of pharmacy, a top researcher in this domain, honorary member of SRIF and the first pharmacist from Romania, member of the International Academy of the History of Pharmacy. She had an unique and fruitful professional, scientific and editorial activity.

She was the head of the Division of Documentation in the The State Institute of the Control of Drug and Pharmaceutical Research (ICSMCF) „Petre-Ionescu Stoian”, Bucharest.

Dr. Pharmacist Graziella Lygia Narcisa Baicu died on 15th of April 2020, 7. 00 AM at Bucharest, because of a heart disease.

Several members of the Romanian Society of the History of Pharmacy offered condolences, from several divisions (Bucharest Iasi, Brăila, Cluj, Oradea, Sibiu).

Prof. Dr. Honoriu Popescu from Cluj, member in the International Academy of History of Pharmacy (AIHP) express his grief in a poem named *In Honorem...*

Sit tibi terra levis! Requiescat in pace!

Pharmacist Franz Winkler (5.3.1929-7.9.2020)



September 7, 2020, died at the age of 92, Franz Winkler. Winkler came from a long-established Innsbruck pharmacist family, so his choice of profession, he studied pharmacy, also connected his special interest in the history of pharmacy. After the war, the private pharmaceutical historical collection stored during these years, which went back to his grandfather Ludwig Winkler, was restored and re-erected on Franz Winkler's initiative. From 1965 to 1999 Franz Winkler was President of the Austrian Society for the History of Pharmacy, at the same time Vice-President of the International Society for the History of Pharmacy (IGGP) for a number of years, and since 1977 a member of the Académie internationale d'histoire de la pharmacie. In 1961 and 1977 he organized the International Congress for the History of Pharmacy in Innsbruck for the IGGP. In addition to this commitment to the history of pharmacy and the corresponding companies, Franz Winkler was drawn into professional politics very early on, so from 1962 to 1964 he held the position of regional branch manager of the Chamber of Pharmacists in Tyrol. From 1964 Vice-President of the Austrian Chamber of Pharmacists in Vienna, then also chairman of the Pharmacists' Association, representing the interests of the self-employed pharmacists, Franz Winkler was elected President of the Austrian Chamber of Pharmacists in 1980, which he held for 16 years until 1996.

After a long and extremely active life, Franz Winkler fell asleep peacefully on September 7th after a short illness.

Michael A. Iran

Report of the 2nd International Congress on History of Medicine in Iran and Islam

The 2nd International Congress on History of Medicine in Iran and Islam was held by the school of Persian Medicine at Tehran University of Medical sciences, Nov. 26-29, 2019/ Tehran - Iran. The International Academy of History of Pharmacy and Iranian Society for the History of Pharmacy were co-organizers of this International event. More than 200 participants and presenters from 15 countries attended in this Congress. There were 2 workshops and 17 scientific sessions for keynote speakers and oral presenters as well as 2 sessions for poster presentations. Dr. Arman Zargaran, the member of the International Academy of History of Pharmacy was the scientific secretary of the congress. Also, Prof. Bruno Bonnemain (the president of the Academy) gave an online speech as "Welcome Message" and Prof. Olivier Lafont (president, Société d'Histoire de la Pharmacie, France) presented an speech entitled "Greek Science to Persian Medicine and to the School of Salernum: a dialogue between Orient and Occident" in the opening ceremony by video conference.

Also, the event was continued by a series of workshops entitled "Methodology of Research in History of Medicine and Pharmacy" in the historical city of Shiraz/ Nov. 30 – Dec. 1, 2019.

SOCIETATEA ROMÂNĂ DE ISTORIA FARMACIEI
THE ROMANIAN SOCIETY OF THE HISTORY OF PHARMACY
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En cette année 2020, (janvier-octobre) l'activité dans notre société, SRHP, n'a pas eu lieu que localement, comme cela se produit dans tous les pays, à cause de la pandémie et des restrictions imposées par les autorités nationales. Nous n'avons plus eu la possibilité d'organiser des réunions avec nos membres de Sections Régionales, pas même pour l'Assemblée Nationale Annuelle. Cependant, Internet a été très utile pour publier des articles dans divers revues. *Quant aux* rapports annuels des sections de la SRHP, nous espérons les avoir au début de l'année prochaine, en mars 2021!

Dans un article publié dans la revue Galenus, dans l'introduction j'ai dit: "La recherche scientifique (passée, présente et future), concerne des

spécialistes de tous les domaines d'activité, économiques et sociaux". Un document sur la médicament (en particulier industriel) a été publié, en Supplément du Journal Médical Roumain (la Revue Médicale Roumaine), intitulé „*Recherche et industrie pharmaceutique roumaine au Centenaire*”. Le volume a été publié cette année, 2020, à Bucarest, à Amaltea Medical Publishing House, sous les auspices de l'Académie des Sciences Médicales (ASM), l'Association Médicale Roumaine (AMR), avec le soutien du Collège Roumain des Médecins (CRM). Dans ce volume d'environ 200 pages (pdf), deux articles ont été acceptés avec pour titres: 1. *L'école roumaine de pharmacie de Bucarest - passé, présent et perspectives*; 2. *Personnalités exceptionnelles de la recherche pharmaceutique roumaine - 100 ans*. Les auteurs sont des enseignants des Facultés de Pharmacie de Bucarest, Iași (Iassy), Cluj-Napoca [1,2].

Le Conseil de la SRHP entretient une correspondance occasionnelle avec certains membres des Sociétés d'Histoire de la Pharmacie, - d'Espagne (à Madrid avec le Professeur Dr. Maria del Carmen Francés-Causapé, membre d'Honneur de la AIHP), - avec la Société Catalane (SCHF), -de Serbie, -de Pologne, -de la République de Moldavie. Nous présentons les couvertures du Supplément au Journal Médical Roumain [pdf (RMJ- pages: 11/15 - 20/24; et 21/27 - 28/34)] et la couverture du dernier numéro de la Revista SCHF [Any14 –Núm. 35 - Juin 2020]. Au siège de la notre Société (SRHP), nous avons toute la collection de cette revue, pour 14 années consécutives.

In this year 2020, (January-October) the activity in our company, SRHP, did not take place only locally, as it happens in all countries, due to the pandemic and the restrictions imposed by the national authorities . We no longer had the possibility to organize meetings with our members of Regional Sections, - not even for the Annual National Assembly. However, the Internet has been very useful for publishing articles in various journals. Annual reports from the sections of the SRHP, we hope to have them at the beginning of next year, in March 2021!

In an article published in the journal Galenus, in the introduction I said: Scientific research (past, present and future) concerns specialists in

all fields of activity, economic and social. An album on medicine (especially industrial) has been published, in Supplement of the Romanian Medical Journal (Romanian Medical Journal), titled „Romanian pharmaceutical research and industry at the Centenary.” The volume was published this year, 2020, in Bucharest , at Amaltea Medical Publishing House, under the auspices of the Academy of Medical Sciences (ASM), the Romanian Medical Association (AMR), with the support of the Romanian College of Physicians (CRM). In this volume of about 200 pages (pdf), two papers were accepted with the titles: 1. Romanian School of Pharmacy in Bucharest - past, present and perspectives 2. Outstanding figures in Romanian pharmaceutical research - 100 years The authors are faculty teachers of Pharmacy of Bucharest, Iași (Iassy), Cluj-Napoca [1,2].

We, the Board of the SRHP, maintain occasional correspondence with certain members of the Pharmacy History Societies, - from Spain (in Madrid with Professor Dr. Maria del Carmen Francés-Causapé, Honorary member of the AIHP), - with the Catalan Society (SCHF), -from Serbia, -from Poland, -from the Republic of Moldova. We present the covers of the Supplement to the Romanian Medical Journal [pdf (RMJ- pages: 11/15 - 20/24; and 21/27 - 28/34)] and the cover of the latest issue of Revista SCHF [Any14 –Núm. 35 - June 2020]. At the headquarters of our Company (SRHP), we have the entire collection of this journal, for 14 consecutive years.


